\$301,600 Raised for Great Ideas at HEF's Royal Bash

Hopkins Education Foundation (HEF) Royal Bash 2020, held Saturday, February 22, at the Marriott Minnetonka Southwest, boasted a packed ballroom of more than 400 patrons of Hopkins Public Schools. The event, the single largest annual source of funding for the nonprofit, raised \$301,600 to directly benefit Hopkins Public Schools' students through grants and district-wide endeavors. *Pathways to a Healthy Future*, HEF's ambitious partnership with the District for 2020-2022, is fully funded for the coming school year. It significantly enhances wholistic support to students and provides access to multiple exciting pathways to learning. *Pathways to a Healthy Future* expands on recent HEF-funded projects such as the three Student Wellness Centers at Hopkins High School, North and West Junior Highs. The four components of *Pathways* address student learning from multiple directions.

- 1) Project Based Learning (PBL) at each elementary school includes WeShare Solar Suitcases at Meadowbrook, Midwest Wildlife Floating Islands at Glen Lake, Kitchen a la Cart at Alice Smith, Cultural Celebrations at Eisenhower/XinXing Academy, Courtyard Redesign at Tanglen, and Greenhouse Design/Build at Gatewood.
- 2) **Calming Corners** in all K-6 classrooms will be a designated cordoned-off space containing HEF-funded tools for self-regulation, reducing disruptions in learning for all.
- 3) **Food Shelf and 'Second Breakfast' Carts** at Hopkins High School ensure all students have access to adequate nutrition and are fortified to focus on learning.
- 4) Care for the Caregivers will bring in three renowned professionals to address staff well-being at the school year's kick-off meeting in late August.

Dr. Rhoda Mhiripiri-Reed, Hopkins Schools Superintendent, drew a standing ovation for her remarks about Hopkins' current trajectory from 'Great to World Class'. Other Royal Bash highlights included a rousing student performance from Hopkins High School's LMPM Drum Line (Lean Mean Performance Machine Pep Band). The band led patrons into the dining room and punctuated HEF's 25th Birthday Cake Auction with exciting drum rolls.

Renowned auctioneer Karen Sorbo sold 10 unique and exciting Live Auction items including Premier Seating at Hopkins High School Graduation Ceremony, a Canoe and paddles built by Alice Smith Elementary School students (through a previous HEF grant with Urban Boatbuilders), and 3 trips to Tuscany, Italy. The Silent Auction, packed with a wide range of fun items and local services, included 'Great Gatherings': unique events hosted from March to October by HEF patrons.
